For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Dunes Alternative HS Combined Report 2016-17

Over the past 5 years, our school has provided 130 seniors the opportunity to graduate on time and become college, career and life ready. The Dunes Alternative High School continues to focus on providing every opportunity as possible to give the students the appropriate classes to recover credits in a small, flexible learning environment

During our first four years 90% our students graduated early or on time. The move from a traditional classroom setting to an entire online Odysseyware or Michigan Virtual blended instruction model has proven to be successful and has assisted in improved MME results and graduation rates.

About Our School

The Dunes Alternative School is an alternative school setting serving students in 11th – 12th grade. The Dunes is recognized as an opportunity for an alternative education option. The school audits the students' transcripts and provides the appropriate classes to meet the Michigan Merit Curriculum credits of 18. The Dunes is unique in the sense of scheduling flexibility to meet each student's needs.

The Dunes Alternative was designed to assist fourth year in building students to still graduate on time when credit deficient by flexible scheduling and providing more class opportunity with in a quarterly periods. Allowing 16 or more classes within a year compared to 12 in the traditional school setting.

School Improvement

The main goal for The Dunes Alternative High School is for 100% of students to graduate with their cohort group.

Core curriculum documents can also be located at www.michigan.gov/HSCE. At the present time, ELA, Mathematics, and Science are implementing the Michigan State Standards. Odysseyware courses are aligned to the standards and manipulated by WOHS teachers to match course outcomes.

In addition to our regular hours of operation our Dunes Students have time both before and after school for assistance and time to complete classes over and beyond the regular school day.

Aggregate Student Achievement Results on Nationally Normed Achievement Tests

Qualifying students at the Dunes take the MME and ACT test. In 2015-16, 100% of students were tested during the testing window. Due to the small size of The Dunes Alternative High School, aggregate student achievement data is not reported by the state (<30 students).

IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-Teacher conferences in The Dunes are student-led and student-scheduled. Attendance at Parent teacher conferences in 2016-17 was 90%.

This data coincides with the adoption of Infinite Campus which has given parents more access to student grades and attendance on a daily basis. The administration meets with each family prior to entering the program and we have student led conferences in the fall and spring. Prior to graduation we also have a counselor meet with each family for a transcript audit to approve graduation and all course completion. Every four weeks a Dunes progress report is sent home to each family to show student success on each course assigned. Each student has targets and goals shown and a bar graph showing where each student is along the process to the ultimate goal of graduating on time.

College-Prep Opportunities

Dunes Alternative High School has local community colleges visit the classroom to discuss college entrance. Also, our students visit a college campus to become familiar with college student life. We have a college advisor that meets with each student to fill out the FAFSA form and college applications. Dunes students also write a resume and are connected with local employment opportunities.

Additional Points of Pride About Our School

Students become ingrained in the power of success and accomplishment in school. Focus on the future, setting attainable goals and understanding each individual's talents that can be shared in our community. Dunes staff work hard to ensure that Dunes graduates are attending a community college, have joined the military, or are employed full time upon graduation. Transition planning for life after high school is an area of focus and continuous improvement.

At this time our Dunes School has been operating for only five years. The Dunes Alternative High School plans to have 40 students enrolled in 2016-17. Please see associated data file for score reports. The Dunes employs two, part-time, highly qualified teachers (math and ELA) and one full time lab technician. A part time guidance counselor is also available to assist students with academic and career counseling as well as personal, social-emotional support.
