A regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 7 p.m. at West Ottawa Public Schools' Administration Office, 1138 136th Avenue.

Instructional Services

T. Smith reported the Student Services & K-5 Instruction committee met on April 9 and discussed the following: upcoming summer professional development (PD) opportunities; the required annual school improvement processes; Jana Hazecamp provided math PD to our Math Cohort 2 teachers on March 4; the first ever elementary WO Ed Camp was held on March 6; and M-STEP testing.

L. Rutan reported the Finance & Facilities committee met on March 27 and discussed the following: the 2019-20 budget; a food service update for the 2017-18 program; the two-year extension of our food service program with Zeeland Public Schools; and the District was awarded the ASBO Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting for the fourth year in a row and is the only district in Ottawa County to receive this certification.

R. Schipper reported the Finance & Personnel committee met on March 26 and discussed the following: hiring and financial expenditures recently released for the state. We continue to compare well with district's across the state with regard to utility usage.

Associate Superintendent of Business Services J. English reported the Great Lakes Elementary School roof that was installed in 1998 was damaged during high winds from the east on April 12, 2019. An insurance claim has been filed, and the District is going to have to replace a good portion of that roof. The funds for this repair will come out of the general or repair and improvement fund.

Superintendent Martin explained the Board needs to select someone to represent the District at the OAISD board election meeting. Candidates for the OAISD Board of Education have until May 6, 2019, to file. The OAISD has two seats to fill. As of today's date, the District is aware that the following two people have filed: Ron Eding from Hamilton (incumbent) and Rick Dernberger (current Board President for Zeeland Public Schools).

There was discussion regarding D. Duistermars being designated as the District's election representative to vote on behalf of the Board, with S. McKanna as the alternate.

Moved by S. McKanna, supported by R. Schipper, that the Ottawa Area Intermediate School District Resolution Designating the District's Election Representative and Candidates be considered for approval during the May 20 regular meeting. Motion carried 6-0-0.
