INFORMATION ITEMS

Superintendent's Update

Lisa Maycroft from GMB Architecture & Engineering presented the design plan for Harbor Lights Middle School. She reviewed the work completed with funds from the 2014 bond, and presented plans for the rest of the facility using funds from the 2019 bond.

J. English reported on the next steps for the bond passed on May 7, 2019, and the bond parameters resolution on the agenda tonight as an action item.

Mr. English also congratulated the Transportation Department on being the Ottawa County winner of the bus rodeo they hosted this past weekend.

Student Senate Representative Jurrien Wilson reported on the following:

- A total of 98 students earned Division 1 Excellent ratings at the State Choral Festival on May 6. Along with these ratings, the WO Vocalaires were selected (for the very first time) to perform at the Michigan Youth Arts Festival on May 10.
- Senior Oscar Night was May 10.
- The Women's Tennis Team are both Conference and Regional champions.
- Senior Breakfast and Convocation are on May 21, following which the seniors plan to walk through their personal elementary schools
- WOHS Graduation is May 23, immediately followed by the Senior Jungle celebration
- The Class of 2019 senior gift to West Ottawa Public Schools is a social-emotional support service dog that will be donated to Great Lakes Elementary School upon completion of its training for this role.
- D. Duistermars reported the Student Services and Instructional Services committees combined to meet on May 7 and receive an update on the 3rd grade retention law and instructional technology.
- K. McCoy reported the following items were discussed during the May 14 Finance and Facilities committee meeting: monthly financial reports, data comparing West Ottawa to similar districts in West Michigan, 2019-20 grant allocations, Harbor Lights design plans, and four action items on tonight's agenda (2019-20 meal prices, the purchase of a wheel-chair accessible bus, Great Lakes Elementary's roof, and a bond resolution),
- T. Smith reported the Finance & Personnel committee met on April 23 and discussed the current status of hiring for the 2019-20 school year and school funding.

There was discussion on the District's voting delegate/alternate and choice of two candidates the voting delegate will vote for at the June 3, 2019, biennial election for the two open seats on the Ottawa Area Intermediate School District Board of Education.
