Lost and found items can be found by the bus lot doors. Please check this frequently as items will be donated to a local organization after fall conferences.


Parent Pick Up/Drop Off Etiquette

Internet Safety and Digital Citizenship: It's that time of the year that I speak with my students about these 2 topics. I would also like to pass on some helpful Internet tips to parents. Agree with your child rules for Internet use in your home.

Try to reach an agreement with your child on the guidelines which apply to Internet use in your household. Here are some tips to get started.

- Discuss when and for how long it is acceptable for your child to use the Internet
 - •Agree how to treat personal information (name, address, telephone, e-mail)
 - •Discuss how to behave towards others when gaming, chatting, e-mailing or messaging
 - Agree what type of sites and activities are OK or not OK in our family
 - •Follow the rules yourself! Or at least explain why the rules are different for adults.

Music Notes from Mr. Loughrin

Lakewood students are learning music notation through a program called "Rockin' Rhythm Raps". With this program, we focus on rhythm only, learning note values and their respective rests. $3^{--}-5^{+-}$ grade students are applying their understanding and composing their own Rockin' Rhythm Raps with a partner in a dice game I call, "Roll and Rock". We are then challenging our class to see if they can read our songs accurately. We are also seeing who can create the most interesting and most difficult rhythm patterns. We will be using half notes, half rests, quarter notes, quarter rests and sets of two eighth notes and even dotted half notes. Can you read the rhythm to this minuet written by Johann Sebastian Bach? (Don't forget the repeat sign!)
