

How to Read Music

In music class 4th and 5th grade students are reviewing the basics of music notation and growing our understanding of music notation as a system of organizing pitch and rhythm. We have been using a wonderful TedEd video as a launching point to review what we know as well as explore some ideas and concepts that might be new to us. Though the video is only a little over five minutes long, it is packed with information, presented in a fast paced and engaging format.

Our approach to music notation is a conceptual one, in addition to developing our music reading skills. We have been making many connections to other languages to help us make sense of and decode the language of music. These skills will help students as we prepare for our recorder unit which begins in January and will help prepare us for the musical opportunities that lie ahead in 6th grade band and choir.
