

It has been a wonderful week in technology!


Within the next couple weeks students will have the opportunity to identify mistakes in code, then modify the code to run the programs correctly. They will plan, test and modify the plan in order to solve an engineering challenge with Ozoblocky.

Students are also programming Micro:bits on their Chromebooks. Micro:bits have small led lights which can flash messages. They also have motion sensors and they can be hooked up to other devices through cables and Bluetooth technology. It has been a lot of fun creating flashing hearts, dice that would change numbers after shaken, and many other fun programs!

The lower elementary students are using markers and OzoCodes to complete a scavenger hunt for an assortment of winter items. Students have been required to find the fastest path to visit every item, but every item must be visited only once!




