Greetings Lakewood Families,

I hope everyone had a relaxing and enjoyable Spring Break. As we move into our last stretch of the school year, we will once again be administering the M Step State Assessments this year. Recently, the State of Michigan applied for a waiver from the Federal Government to alleviate the testing requirement this year. However, that request has been denied. The M Step testing will proceed as follows:

5th grade will be taking assessments in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies. Testing will begin for 5th grade on April 20 and will conclude on April 28.

4th grade will be taking assessments in ELA and Math. Testing will begin on May 11 and conclude on May 13.

3rd grade will be taking assessments in ELA and Math. Testing will begin on April 27 and conclude on April 29.

Please do your best to assure that students are well rested, and have adequate nutrition and hydration so that they can all perform to their best ability on the M Step.

We are still working out details on our end-of- the year fundraiser and will be sure to communicate details as soon as they are finalized.

Finally, please be sure to continue to practice safety measures in regards to COVID 19. Although we are not currently experiencing high numbers at Lakewood, the recent increase in cases across the state warrants great care and consideration.



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



Two little bluebirds sitting on a hill...

Kindergarteners learned a song about two little bluebirds. The song was part of a mini-book that students could read or sing, "Two Little Bluebirds".

As part of "March is Reading Month" students practiced singing and reading the book in class and then were asked to take it home and sing it or read it to someone at home.

The end of March and into April is bluebird time in West Michigan. Bluebirds are migrating north and stop in our area to nest before moving farther north. Students learned about how and where bluebirds nest and how humans have impacted their habitat, but are now helping to preserve and protect this delicate species of birds.

Pandemic 4 6 1

Important information for parents or guardians of student's eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch at Lakewood Elementary School.

What is the Pandemic-EBT Program?

The Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program gives food benefits to families with children who were not able to get free or reduced-price school meals due to COVID. You may hear about this benefit from other schools or in the media.

Who is eligible?

Being eligible for this program will depend on what school your student attends. Eligibility for the Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program can be different between schools within the same district.

What makes a school eligible for P-EBT?

A school building is eligible only if the building has had 5 school days in a row of reduced in-person hours due to COVID.

What could make my student eligible for P-EBT?

- 1) If the school they attend is eligible for P-EBT and
- 2) If your student normally gets free and reduced meals at school and
- 3) If your student is not getting instruction in-person for some or all the month.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) issues P-EBT benefits based on:

- How each school building reports their eligibility
- How most of the students attend school during the month

There may be months when your student's attendance was different from what the school reported. In that case, you may be able to have your student's benefit level reconsidered. Your request to be reconsidered must be submitted by June 30, 2021. In the month(s) below your school reported primarily in-person. Your student(s) may be P-EBT eligible if they attended class on-line, for some time or all the time in the following month(s):

September 2020, October 2020, November 2020, December 2020, and January 2021

PICKING UP A STUDENT


If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.


Please remember to sign out your student.

Students exhibiting at least **one primary COVID-19 symptom** OR at least **two sec-**

ondary symptoms must return home ASAP.

To return to school, students must:

- Receive a negative COVID-19 test,
- Be signed off by a doctor (DO or MD), or
- Self-isolate for 14 days or until symptoms are gone—whichever is longer.

To return in less than 14 days, you **must** supply a negative test or doctor's note.




