GET IN THE LOOP WITH LAKEWOOD!

MORNING DROP OFF

First bell rings at 8:35 AM. Students arriving after 8:35 AM are considered tardy.

To drop off a tardy student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

PICKING UP A STUDENT

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, **please give the front office a call** and **email your student's teacher**.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.



Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. **Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!**

COVID-19 PROTOCOL

A reality of this school year has been managing the outbreak of COVID-19.

Students exhibiting at least **one primary COVID-19 symptom** OR at least **two secondary symptoms** must return home ASAP. To return to school, **students must**:

- Receive a negative COVID-19 test,
- Be signed off by a doctor (DO or MD), or
- Self-isolate for 10 days or until symptoms are gone—whichever is longer.

To return in less than 10 days, you **must** supply a negative test or doctor's note.



Dear Parents and Guardians:

As many Michigan schools are working hard with concluding the current school year, they are also preparing for the return of students for the 2021-2022 school year. The Michigan Department of Health & Human Services (MDHHS), Division of Immunization wishes to remind you that Michigan schools are required to report immunization information regardless of their mode of instruction (in-person, virtual, and combinations of both). Any student who fails to meet the school immunization requirements shall not be admitted, or able to participate in school classes and activities.

Although you are probably juggling a lot of responsibilities right now, making sure your children are up to date on their shots is one of the best things you can do to protect them against several serious but preventable diseases. Michigan has seen a sharp drop in vaccinations since the start of the pandemic, which is a frightening trend. When children are not vaccinated, they are at risk of getting diseases like measles, chicken pox, and hepatitis A. Falling vaccination rates can lead to new outbreaks of dangerous diseases. The enclosed document lists all vaccines required in Michigan for school entry.

If your child is not fully vaccinated, please reach out to your child's primary care provider to schedule an immunization appointment. Healthcare providers have taken steps to assure their offices are safe for visits and are available to answer any questions that you have. If your family does not have a primary care provider, or if you are not able to get an appointment for vaccines, many <u>local county health departments</u> (www.Michigan.gov/LHDMap) and some pharmacies are offering vaccine appointments.

Thank you for assuring your children are current on all immunizations. This protects not only them from vaccine preventable diseases, but also their classmates, teachers, and the community.



Attention incoming 6th grade boys and parents!

See the letter below regarding a summer running opportunity.

Dear incoming 6th-8th grade boys and parents,

I hope the end of this strange school year is going well for you all. I was glad to see the boys running track, playing tennis, and acting in the play. As coach, I have two goals. I want you to have fun TOGETHER as a team, and I want you to IMPROVE as athletes.

Cross country traditionally starts as soon as school opens. We're hoping to start strong next season, so I'd like to encourage the boys to train over the summer. We've got an opportunity to run really fast next year; our sixth and seventh-grade times were competitive with the best programs in the state, but we need to keep working to accomplish our goals.

Improvement depends on setting small goals that will lead to larger ones and working consistently. One option is to track your mileage on this <u>form</u>. I've included some goals on the form (with prizes). The second option is to run together at OPTIONAL workouts over the summer.

I'd love to get you guys together for some group runs this summer. Because they are OPTIONAL, you DON'T need a physical on file with the district (although you will need a physical once the season starts). These group runs are a great way to build a foundation for the season, train with the team, and have fun.

Coach Knoll, the high school coach, is running a camp for sixth-eighth graders too. Here's the <u>link</u> to register. It starts on July 19. You could even run with the high school guys on Monday mornings (Riley Trails: 8-9:30) if you're interested this summer.

Below, you'll find some training goals and details about our optional summer runs. Feel free to pass this along to other interested parents and runners.

(Optional) Group Training Runs:

Tuesday Night Runs: <u>Riley Trails</u>. 7:00-8:00 pm. June 15-August 17

Thursday **Morning** Runs: Mt. Pisgah parking lot (just west of The General Store). Speed and Strength. 8:00-9:00 **am**. **July 1-August 19**

Summer Running Program

Becoming a stronger runner depends on consistency. Set goals and work regularly toward them. Keep a record of your running <u>here</u>. I recommend at least one longer run each week and lots of fun, fast running.

Sixth graders: Try to run at least three days each week (but not more than five). Aim for 900 minutes between June and August. (That's a little over 60 minutes/week.)

Seventh Graders: Try to run at least three days each week (but not more than five). Aim for 1,000 minutes between June and August. (That's around 75 minutes/week.)

Eighth Graders: Try to run at least three days each week (but not more than five). Aim for 1,100 minutes between June and August. (That's about 85 minutes/week.)

PRIZES for reaching these goals will be awarded in September during the first week of practice. I may distribute additional prizes over the summer too!

I'm excited to run together this summer. Please, pass this along to any middle school boys (including incoming sixth-graders) who like to run.



Pandemic

Important information for parents or guardians of

student's eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch at Lakewood Elementary School.

What is the Pandemic-EBT Program?

The Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program gives food benefits to families with children who were not able to get free or reduced-price school meals due to COVID. You may hear about this benefit from other schools or in the media.

Who is eligible?

Being eligible for this program will depend on what school your student attends. Eligibility for the Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program can be different between schools within the same district.

What makes a school eligible for P-EBT?

A school building is eligible only if the building has had 5 school days in a row of reduced in-person hours due to COVID.

What could make my student eligible for P-EBT?

- 1) If the school they attend is eligible for P-EBT and
- If your student normally gets free and reduced meals at school and
- 3) If your student is not getting instruction in-person for some or all the month.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) issues P-EBT benefits based on:

- How each school building reports their eligibility
- How most of the students attend school during the month

There may be months when your student's attendance was different from what the school reported. In that case, you may be able to have your student's benefit level reconsidered. Your request to be reconsidered must be submitted by June 30, 2021. In the month(s) below your school reported primarily in-person. Your student(s) may be P-EBT eligible if they attended class on-line, for some time or all the time in the following month(s): September 2020, October 2020, November 2020, December 2020, January 2021, February 2021, and

March 2021
