#### PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Greetings Lakewood Families,

We've just completed our beginning of the year assessments in both ELA and Math. For ELA assessments we use the Acadience platform to assess student progress three times per year. We also use the Fountas and Pinell running records throughout the year to identify the need for intervention or enrichment. These are in addition to the regularly scheduled assessments using the Reading Street curriculum. For Math we use the beginning of the year and the end of the year Math Expressions assessments in addition to the regularly scheduled unit assessments that are given throughout the year. If you are curious about any of the assessment tools that we use to measure progress, please consult with your child's teacher.

We are very lucky this year to have added some student services at Lakewood. This year we are privileged to have added nursing services two days a week. These services are provided by Holland Hospital. Amy Verbeek is our school nurse this year and she handles a great chunk of our medical needs that we experience at Lakewood. We are also lucky to have been able to add a full time Academic Interventionist. Colin Baron will serve in that role by providing intervention services throughout the day as well as overseeing our newly formed after school tutoring program. Our tutoring program will be staffed by our own teachers and we hope to see great strides in our students' achievement levels as a result of offering these services.

Finally, in celebration of Homecoming at West Ottawa, we will be celebrating Spirit Week! The activities are as follows:

#### Student Pick Up


If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

#### SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.



If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



A reality of this school year has been managing the outbreak of COVID-19.

Students exhibiting at least **one primary COVID-19 symptom** OR at least **two sec- ondary symptoms** must return home ASAP.
To return to school, **students must**:

- Receive a negative COVID-19 test,
- Be signed off by a doctor (DO or MD), or
- Self-isolate for 10 days or until symptoms are gone—whichever is longer.

To return in less than 10 days, you **must** supply a negative test or doctor's note.

#### **COVID-19 Protocol**






