Get in the Loop with Lakewood!

Morning Drop Off

First bell rings at 8:35 AM. Students arriving after 8:35 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



COVID-19 PROTOCOL


Please call the front office if you have any concerns regarding COVID-19 procedure at the school.

NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.

PBIS Corner

What is PBIS?

PBIS stands for **Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports**.

This research-based program focuses on acknowledging positive behaviors while also providing interventions to help students with behavioral struggles.

PBIS is used district wide but can be tailored to fit the needs of individual buildings.

At Lakewood, PBIS is tied to our building-wide expectations of being:

RESPECTFUL,

RESPONSIBLE, AND

READY TO LEARN

Students are taught these expectations at the beginning of the school year through staff-lead stations and are given reminders and reteaching as needed.

PBIS is not a "no consequence" system but allows students to see the benefits they can receive for making positive choices and teaches them the skills necessary to make those choices.

We have spent a lot of time coding this month of November!
Students were introduced to our little friend, Evo! Evo is an Ozobot. What is the purpose of an Ozobot?
Ozobots can identify lines, colors, and codes on both digital surfaces, such as an iPad, and physical surfaces, such as paper.
Students spent time exploring different codes to program their own Evo Ozobot. This week, students were challenged to specifically program their bots to move in directions that would allow them to collect as many points as possible on their "hay ride." Students needed to know when to use straight, left or right codes, and also know when it was appropriate to slow down on corners to prevent an "ozobot catastrophe!"


Students also focused on using Ozoblockly, an online program that uses block coding. That program can be uploaded into the Ozobots!

After Thanksgiving, we will be focusing on Hour of Code! We continue to learn more about coding online!

How We Read Music: Music Notation

In music class, 2nd graders have been reviewing the basics of music notation and growing our understanding of music notation as a system of organizing pitch and rhythm. Among other resources, we have been using a wonderful Ted ed video as a launching point to review what we know as well as explore some ideas and concepts that might be new to us. Though the video is only a little over five minutes long, it is packed with information, presented in a fast paced and engaging format.

Our approach to music notation is a conceptual one. We have been making many connections to other languages to help us make sense of and decode the language of music. These skills will help students as we prepare for future years as well as middle school when students have to put it all together to read music notes.

- Families with special health care needs will be provided with longer vaccination appointment times.
- When registering, please include any accommodations your child will need and any additional
 information about your child that would be helpful for nurses to know in the "notes" section of
 the registration form, such as if you have a preference for an appointment at your vehicle.
- When registering, use the child's name as the contact.
- Please do not enter the parent's name until prompted.
- Appointments are for vaccination only. Clinics will not be able to provide any other medical services.
- Please bring anything your child will need to successfully complete their vaccination appointment.
