



Morning Drop Off

First bell rings at 8:35 AM. **Students arriving after 8:35 are considered tardy.**

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please **give the front office a call** and email **your student's teacher**.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between **8-9am and 3-4pm.**

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, **please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.**

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. **Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!**



COVID-19 PROTOCOL


Please call the front office if you have any concerns regarding COVID-19 procedure at the school.

NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.



Get in the Loop with Lakewood!

PBIS Corner

Why are there so many pyramids in education?

PBIS uses a pyramid to represent the three levels of interventions available to students based on the percentage of students that should be receiving each level of support. As the intensity of support increases the number of students receiving it decreases.

What does each Tier look like?

Tier 1 supports are universal. They are available to all students. This is the level of intervention that focuses on the acknowledgment of positive choices. Ask your child about pom poms and certificates to learn more.

Tier 2 is for a small number of students who need a little more support. They still get acknowledgement from Tier 1 but also get a little extra time with an adult at school. This may be in a social skills group, a check-in system, or a positive behavior support plan. The goal of Tier 2 is to teach the necessary skills to make a student successful at Tier 1.


Tier 3 has the fewest number of students (5% or less of the student population). These students still get Tier 1 and Tier 2 support, but may need a very structured behavior plan and/or special education intervention.

The GSRP is a state-funded program for low-income families or families with certain environmental risks. To qualify, children must be four years old by September 1st of the enrollment year *and* proof of income submitted.

West Ottawa offers the GSRP at Pine Creek Elementary, Great Lakes Elementary, and Lakewood Elementary.

The world of coding continues in the tech lab!

Using Scratch Jr., students were challenged to use motion blocks to create programs that showed off their animal's creature powers! They were encouraged to use the hide and show block if their animal used their camouflage power, the speed block if their animal was fast, and the grow block if their animal used size to scare off predators!

Students also were challenged to create a video game using multiple characters and a game over screen. Ask your child about how a video gamer must tweak those characters to get them just right!

Another focus this week was sequencing. We discussed how important it was to have certain programming in the right order! It makes a difference in the product! Students had fun with the Fuzz Bug Factory and coding with Kodable!

Music Notes from Mr. Loughrin



JOHN WILLIAMS

Who's Who in the world of Music...

First grade students have been learning all about instruments of the orchestra. Fourth graders will be singing and playing with an orchestra in April. All of them are learning the important role of the conductor. One of the conductors we have learned about is John Williams. John Williams is a conductor, but also a famous composer.

If you have ever seen the movie *Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban*, tuned into the NBC Nightly News, or watched the Olympic Games, you'll hear the music of **John Williams**. He has received 42 Academy Awards, and has also written music for the Concert Hall (symphonies, concerti, fanfares and Olympic themes.) Born on February 8, 1932, in Floral Park, NY, John Towner Williams studied bassoon, cello, clarinet, trombone and trumpet as a child, forming a band with several friends. Later he studied piano and worked as a pianist in movie studios in Los Angeles, CA. His big break came when he began working with film director Stephen Spielberg, writing music for the movie *Jaws*. He went on to write the music for *Raiders of the Lost Ark* and *Jurassic Park* and finally *Star Wars*. In 1979, John Williams became the conductor of the Boston Pops Orchestra. He continues to compose music for film and concert audiences around the world.

TTQ SPRING 2022 SEASON

This spring, the TTQ program is coming back to schools.
