SPREAD THE WORD!

It's time for **Kindergarten Enrollment** for the **2022-2023 school year**!

Get in the Loop with Lakewood!

Morning Drop Off

First bell rings at 8:35 AM. Students arriving after 8:35 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



COVID-19 PROTOCOL

Please call the front office if you have any concerns regarding COVID-19 procedure at the school.

NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.

What is the purpose of the Poms?

Each classroom has a class pom pom jar (or bucket or bin) where students place poms they earn for making respectful or responsible choices or for being ready to learn.

Poms can be given to any student by any staff member who catches them making good choices. Individual students, small groups or the whole classes can earn poms. Once the classroom jar is full the entire class earns an agreed upon reward.


Examples of possible rewards are: STEM bin time, extra recess, a Magic School bus episode, drawing time, or a small treat.

The big lesson behind these little poms is that each classroom is a small community within the larger school community and communities function best when everyone works together.






Happy February!

We had a ton of fun programming our Micro:bits this week to play a rock, paper, scissors game! We also focused on Super Bowl predicitons. Students had to find information on the ESPN website and use that information they put in their charts to predict who they thought would win the Super Bowl this year! They may have even added some statistics of their favorite teams.

Lower elementary students worked on programming their Micro:bits to create a flashing heart, scrolling marquee, and other creations! Students also had the opportunity to program in Code Monkey to have their monkeys collect bananas and their secret treasure!

5th grade students are preparing for middle school by doing some "ensemble work". Practicing in sections, playing different parts with different notes and different timing.

For this activity, they are playing Boomwackers. If you are not familiar with Boomwackers, they are plastic pipes of different lengths which play different pitches based on their length. Each Boomwacker therefore has a different note in a scale. As a percussion instrument, Boomwackers can be struck on the floor, a hard surface or on a knee or shoe to create a pitched percussion sound.

Here are a couple of cool videos created by an ensemble group at Harvard University. You and your family will likely recognize these popular tunes played in a unique arrangement on Boom-Wackers.



TTQ Spring 2022 Season

This spring, the TTQ program is coming back to schools. TTQ is a fun, high energy after school program designed exclusively for male-identifiying students in 3rd-5th grade; it incorporates strength and stretching exercises with training for a 5K.
