SPREAD THE WORD!

It's time for **Kindergarten Enrollment** for the **2022-2023 school year**!

Morning Drop Off

The morning bell rings at 8:36 AM. Students arriving after 8:36 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.



- Whichever grade level has the highest balance at the end of the challenge will win a special treat!


SPANISH SPOTLIGHT WITH SEÑORA DILLON





Lower elementary students focused on coding their Ozobots with color codes. This week, the challenge was to get our bots to navigate through a maze.



Music Notes from Mr. Loughrin



definition: a short melodic phrase repeated throughout a musical composition

In the digital age, we commonly refer to an ostinato pattern as a "loop", because it loops around and plays over and over. Here is one of Mr. Loughrin's favorite websites and apps that allows you to build songs using a wide variety of ostinato (or Loop) patterns.

"Incredibox is a musical app in which you can quickly and easily create a mix by running a band of beatboxers". It is one of the coolest and most fun music websites I have ever seen! Kids and adults can go online to www.incredibox.com (or download the app) and create and arrange their own beat boxing, hip hopping, jazz jumping arrangements using the Incredibox Beat Boxing "dudes". Each "dude" has their own riff or ostinato pattern. You pull them up and assign them a part and they play it. It is a ton of fun and quite addicting!! Check it out!!!!



TTQ Spring 2022 Season

This spring, the TTQ program is coming back to schools. TTQ is a fun, high energy after school program designed exclusively for male-identifiying students in 3rd-5th grade; it incorporates strength and stretching exercises with training for a 5K. Participants in the program will develop positive peer relationships and feel part of a team while working toward individual goals. Additional practice activities focus on developing a healthy lifestyle and resisting peer pressure. The spring season begins the week of March 14, with our final 5K on May 21.
