Regular Meeting

Approved Minutes
April 25, 2022

A regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 7 p.m. at West Ottawa Public Schools' Administration Office, 1138 136th Avenue.

President Lebster opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by R. Schipper, supported by T. Smith, to approve the minutes of the March 21, 2022, work session and regular meeting as presented. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Moved by T. Smith, supported by L. Rutan, that the agenda be approved as presented. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Superintendent Bearden gave recognition to Student Senate President Megan Rockafellow for being the first West Ottawa student ever named to the All-MIPA staff. Associate Superintendent of Business Services J. Malloch reported on the bids that are listed for approval at this meeting for Lakewood and Sheldon Woods, the wood panels for the PAC, the tractor for turf maintenance, and the new elementary watermain materials. He also reported on the contingency increase for the athletic stadium and the Pine creek HVAC upgrades and improvements.

Moved by T. Smith, supported by L. Rutan, that the Board approve, as presented, the bid from Nandoorn in the amount of \$366,000 for wood panels at the new Performing Arts Center. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Moved by L. Rutan, supported by T. Smith, that the Board approve the purchase of the Kawasaki tractor as presented from Centrac in the amount of \$54,640 as recommended by the Associate Superintendent of Business Services. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Moved by R. Schipper, supported by K. McCoy, that the Board approve, as presented, the increase in contingency in the amount of \$300,000 for the New Athletic Complex as recommended by the Associate Superintendent of Business Services. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Moved by K. McCoy, supported by L. Rutan, that the Board approve, as presented, the increase in contingency in the amount of \$150,000 for the Pine Creek HVAC upgrades and improvement project as recommended by the Associate Superintendent of Business Services. Motion carried 5-0-0.

Moved by R. Schipper, supported by L. Rutan, that the Board approve, as presented, the bid from Wood Trucking in the amount of \$218,315 for the New Elementary Water Main as presented by the Associate Superintendent of Business Services. Motion carried 5-0-0.
