Greetings Lakewood Families,

I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving break and were able to spend some quality time with friends and family!

I would like to remind everyone that we do not have adult outdoor coverage in the morning until 8:30 am. It is imperative that students are not dropped prior to that time. You may notice some students outside the 5th grade entrance before 8:30, but those are students who attend Advanced Math and are taking a break between their 7:30 arrival and the 8:30 entrance time. Due to safety concerns for our students, please adhere to the 8:30 am drop off time.

On Wednesday, December 7, we will be hosting the West Ottawa High School Jazz group at 2:30 pm in our gym. This should be a fun and entertaining event for our students and may encourage some interest in the musical offerings at the middle and high school levels.

I would also like to take a moment to remind everyone of the importance of daily attendance. This year, we have re-formed our attendance committee that was on hold during the pandemic. Get in the Loop with Lakewood!

Morning Drop Off

The morning bell rings at 8:36 AM. Students arriving after 8:36 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.

It's been a coding carnival in the tech lab!



It has been a fun week and we will continue next week focusing on more Hour of Code activities!



Many of our students are working this month with a system of syllables and hand signs that many people have heard of, but may not know how it works.

What is Solfege?

The solfege system as we know it dates all the way back to the 1800's, and makes its way into many different methods of teaching singing and aural skills. The **solfege hand signs** (also called the *Kodaly hand signs* or the *Curwen hand signs*) were originally developed by John Curwen, but popularized through their use in the Kodaly method. The idea behind the solfege hand signs is simple: each tone of the seven-note solfege system is given a shape for the singer to make with his/her hand while singing. All of the hand signs can be produced using one hand, and can be helpful for singers who are new to the solfege system.



Many people are familiar with the musical and movie, The Sound of Music. In this story of the Von Trapp family, Maria the nanny and tutor of the Von Trapp children sings the song, "Do-Re-Mi", to teach them how to sing and the notes of the major music scale. The Great Start Readiness Program

The GSRP is a state-funded program for low-income families or families with certain environmental risks. To qualify, children must be four years old by September 1st of the enrollment year *and* proof of income submitted.
