Greetings Lakewood Families,

We have an exciting event coming up shortly that we hope you will be able to attend. On March 12, 2023 we plan to transport elementary families to the Grand Rapids GOLD vs RAPTORS 905 NBA affiliated basketball game at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids. 

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WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

Every winter, bad weather — snow, slush, freezing temperatures or even heavy rains — can present challenges to getting children to school. So do the illnesses such as colds, flu, fevers and earaches that often come with the winter months. Students might also have to stay home due to Covid-19.

Develop back up plans for getting your children to school in bad weather.

- a. Check to see who can give your children a ride to school if you aren't able to take them or the bus doesn't arrive.
- Talk with your school about forming a "walking school bus" with other families to get students to school safely.
- Contact your local government if roads to school are not regularly plowed.
- d. Join other families to clear snow from the sidewalks closest to the school.
- Tell school administrators about transportation challenges, including safety,
 and ask if they have plans for transporting students.

2. Keep your children healthy.

- Maintain a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Ensure students eat a good breakfast every morning or check to see if your school serves breakfast.
- Ensure your children visit their medical provider and have received their vaccines, including flu and Covid.
- Stress hand washing, particularly before and after eating, and after using the restroom.
- Reinforce the importance of avoiding close contact with individuals who are sick, and not sharing cups and/or utensils with others.
- f. If your children seem anxious about going to school, ask teachers, school counselors, your medical provider and parents for advice on how to make your children feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- g. If you are concerned your children may have Covid, call your medical provider or school nurse for advice.

Keep your children engaged in learning if they cannot attend school in person.

- Ask your teacher or school for resources that you can use at home to keep your children learning, including computer tablets, internet access and online learning platforms.
- Identify who can support your children's learning at home, especially if you must go to work.
- Encourage your children to call classmates and stay connected to the teacher to find out about what they missed.

(To the tune of She'll be Coming 'Round the Mountain)


Queso is cheese, yum, yum, yum. (clap clap)

Leche is milk, yum, yum, yum. (clap clap)


Papa is potato.

We also met Smart Cutebot, which is an assembled and ready-to-rock robot smart car. We used it with a Micro:bit and MakeCode! One of the challenges was to make Cutebot dance like a bee. We will be continuing to program Cutebot to make other fun actions.



Second Grade Students are learning about musical "Ostinato". An ostinato is a pattern that repeats. The pattern could be rhythmic or melodic. Ostinati (plural of ostinato) have been used by composers for hundreds of years.

With the evolution of electronics and computers in music, we sometimes refer to ostinati as "loops", sections of rhythm or melody that loop or repeat over and over. Today there are countless apps and programs that allow users to "loop" music to create songs or simply to have fun.

We also explored the concept of an "ear worm", a piece of music that has repeated patterns that can work their way into our brains and either get us whistling or humming a favorite tune or perhaps driving us crazy with a passage that gets stuck in our heads that we cannot seem to switch off.

Morning Drop Off

The morning bell rings at 8:36 AM. Students arriving after 8:36 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

Call 616-786-1300 and press "1" for the attendance line.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!



NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.
