Upper elementary students are now participating in football lead up games and doing awesome.


The students are having a blast, working hard, and being great teammates in all classes. I'm very happy with the work they are doing.

Music Notes from Mr. Loughrin



1<sup>st</sup> graders and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders have been studying the Percussion Family in music class this month. It is one of our favorite families of instruments as we have many percussion instruments in our classroom and percussion instruments are some of the easiest to make from things you can find around your house. Percussion instruments are any instruments that you Strike, Shake, or Scrape. A few examples include bongo drums, conga drums, cymbals, xylophones and maracas.

Experts believe percussion instruments were likely some of the first instruments made and played by humans. Hand claps, banging a stick on a log, or making a drum were fairly simple and rhythm could be kept by striking just about anything. Percussion instruments are fun to make at home from things you find around the house or recycle bin. It is the largest family of instruments and includes drums, shakers, rattles and many more.

Library Check-Out Days Tuesday & Thursday

A reasonable, illness-related written request for the child to stay in for one day will be honored. If additional time is needed, please provide the principal with a written

doctor's explanation of the circumstances.

Promoting Good Attendance

All Winter Long



Every winter, bad weather — snow, slush, freezing temperatures or even heavy rains — can present challenges to getting children to school. So do the illnesses such as colds, flu, fevers and earaches that often come with the winter months. Students might also have to stay home due to Covid-19.

### Develop back up plans for getting your children to school in bad weather.

- a. Check to see who can give your children a ride to school if you aren't able to take them or the bus doesn't arrive.
- b. Talk with your school about forming a "walking school bus" with other families to get students to school safely.
- c. Contact your local government if roads to school are not regularly plowed.
- d. Join other families to clear snow from the sidewalks closest to the school.
- Tell school administrators about transportation challenges, including safety, and ask if they have plans for transporting students.

### 2. Keep your children healthy.

- a. Maintain a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Ensure students eat a good breakfast every morning or check to see if your school serves breakfast.
- c. Ensure your children visit their medical provider and have received their vaccines, including flu and Covid.
- Stress hand washing, particularly before and after eating, and after using the restroom.
- Reinforce the importance of avoiding close contact with individuals who are sick, and not sharing cups and/or utensils with others.
- f. If your children seem anxious about going to school, ask teachers, school counselors, your medical provider and parents for advice on how to make your children feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- g. If you are concerned your children may have Covid, call your medical provider or school nurse for advice.

### 3. Keep your children engaged in learning if they cannot attend school in person.

- a. Ask your teacher or school for resources that you can use at home to keep your children learning, including computer tablets, internet access and online learning platforms.
- b. Identify who can support your children's learning at home, especially if you must go to work.
- c. Encourage your children to call classmates and stay connected to the teacher to find out about what they missed.

### Morning Drop Off

The morning bell rings at 8:36 AM. Students arriving after 8:36 are considered tardy.

To drop off a late student, please park in the south parking lot and walk your student to the front office.

Please remember to sign in your student.

## Student Pick Up

If you need to pick up a student before normal dismissal time, please give the front office a call and email your student's teacher.

After 9:00 AM, you can park in the driveway directly in front of the office.

Please remember to sign out your student.



Please **do not** park in the circle drive by the front office between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You may park in the large parking lot on the southside of the building.

Our special needs buses use the circle drive during those times and need full access to the drive to safely pick up and drop off our special needs students. Thank you for understanding!

## SICK STUDENTS

Illness happens—we understand! If your student must stay home due to illness, please call the front office. Tell us your student's name, teacher, and symptoms.

If a student becomes ill while at school, we may send the student home for monitoring with a parent or guardian. **Ensure your contact information and preferred emergency contacts are up to date in your student's file!** 

### NORMAL ILLNESS PROCEDURE

To reduce the spread of any illness within the school, we ask that you keep your child home if they are sick.

Please also keep your child home until they are 24-hours free of vomiting, diarrhea, and fever (without the use of fever-reducing medication).

And, of course, keep your child's teacher and the front office posted.
