Statement

The administration will consider the presence of hazardous conditions in the provision of pupil transportation services to enrolled students who are not otherwise eligible. The Director of Transportation is solely responsible for the designation of a hazard area and the decision is final and not subject to appeal. Hazard designations may be reviewed periodically and can be removed as conditions change.

Procedures

The Director of Transportation will consider hazard designations when the features of the area are such as would typically alter the way the community uses the area and where it would not be reasonable to expect student movement through the area to access the school of attendance. The Director of Transportation will consider whether other community controls are present that would reasonably maintain or improve safety.

When reviewing a potentially hazardous area, the Director of Transportation will consider the following factors:

- Age of the students
- Traffic volume
- Posted and non-posted speed limits
- Number of traveled lanes
- Sightlines
- Intersections
- Travel conditions
- Grade of road or curve of roadway
- Land use
